

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT THE CSA STATE PAC

Q: What is the CSA State PAC?

A: The CSA State PAC is a voluntary, non-partisan political action committee committed to improving and protecting space enterprise in California. Through your contribution, the space enterprise community will make a unified effort to obtain better government through candidate education and political action.

Q: Who May Contribute to the CSA State PAC?

A: Individuals, partnerships and corporations may contribute, since the CSA State PAC is a political action committee registered within the State of California. Anyone may contribute. The State identification number for the CSA State PAC is 1283984.

Q: Must You Report Contributions to the CSA State PAC?

A: Contributions to the CSA State PAC are reported by CSA as required by the Political Reform Act of 1974 and its various amendments.

Q: How are Contributed Funds to the CSA State PAC Used?

A: Since CSA absorbs the administrative costs of the program, 100% of the CSA State PAC contributions go toward political action.

Q: What is the Purpose of the CSA State PAC?

A: To provide financing through contributions for political efforts in support of state office holders, candidates and political committees (not to include federal office holders, candidates or committees) that improves and protects space enterprise in California.

Q: Who Operates the CSA State PAC?

A: A continuing political campaign fund is managed and operated in accordance with the terms of the CSA Bylaws. The CSA State PAC is administered by a decision-making body, which is approved by the CSA Board of Directors.
